eARTh: Our Planet, Our Art, Our Ideas

Over the years, conversations around climate change have evolved from scientific projections to real-life experiences for people across the world. Heatwaves, floods, and wildfires are today's stark reality. The urgency of climate action is no longer a question but a call to all of us. It is not just the priority of scientists or policymakers but all of us.

Art plays an important role in driving climate action, and the Center for Study of Science, Technology and Policy (CSTEP) launched the **eARTh Initiative** in 2023 to bring art to the heart of the climate conversation. The eARTh Event, an integral part of the initiative, is a platform where artists, environmentalists, policymakers, and community change-makers come together to explore how sustainability and climate action can be inspired through art.

The **second edition** of the **eARTh Event** will be held on **20 September 2024** at **the Bangalore International Centre**, Karnataka. At the event, the first batch of the eARTh Climate Fellows will display their artwork, which has been created over a nine-monthlong fellowship. CSTEP is also collaborating with Slam Out Loud, an organisation that empowers children through art and expression, to talk about various issues, including climate change. Students from Slam Out Loud will perform at the event, and Slam Out Loud will also guide attendees through a session on creating art.

CSTEP's coffee-table book titled *Arth* will be launched at the event. It will feature nine senior artists from different artistic genres and four budding artists, who were part of the eARTh Climate Fellowship. The profiles of the artists will explore their experiences with climate change, sustainability, and the environment and how these aspects are reflected in their creations. The Vasu Dixit Collective will also perform during the event.

Through eARTh, we invite you to be a part of a collaborative movement. Join us as we continue to reimagine the role of art in shaping the future of our planet. This is not just about climate change but about the change we can create together.
